- Case studies of how a learning technology solved a training problem
- Reviews, selection, or customization of off-the-shelf eLearning content
- Interactive technologies for eLearning (e.g., virtual learning environments, social applications, Web 2.0 technologies, simulations, games)
- Mobile learning applications
- Program management strategies for eLearning (e.g., planning, budgeting, ROI calculation, tracking, evaluation) and related software
- Rapid and traditional eLearning development processes

Topics that will not be considered:

- Strategies/solutions that are not related to eLearning and supporting technology
- Human Performance Technology, documentation, and classroom-based learning solutions that do *not* highlight the use of technology to solve a problem

Presentation Guidelines

- Sessions will last 50 minutes, including time for questions.
- Preference will be given to presentations that
 - o Show real-use cases of how eLearning technologies were used to reach business objectives
 - o Are creative, interactive and include audience participation and discussion
- Target audience includes independent contractors and employees of corporations, non-profits, and academic institutions who fill roles such as instructional designers and developers, trainers, technical writers, training directors, content managers, and new media developers.
